Presentation:

The administration has been in the process of hiring a Psychology Faculty. The position was advertised on-line on Sauk Valley Community College's website, *Indeed.com, Chronicle of Higher Education, HigherEdJobs.com,* and in Sauk Valley Media (the *Dixon Telegraph* and the *Daily Gazette*). The College received eighteen applications, and nine candidates were asked to submit a taped interview. Four candidates were invited for an interview. A committee was composed of Dr. Amy Jakobsen, Dr. Paul Edleman, Mandy Aldridge, and Wendy Rienstra. Dr. Patrice Hess, Dean of Transfer Programs and Academic Support Services, served as Chair.

Academic Background: Christy Lincoln graduated from the New College of California with a Master of Arts degree in Clinical Psychology and from Capital University with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and Sociology.

Professional Background: Christy has been employed as an adjunct Psychology Instructor at Sauk Valley Community College since January 2019. She also has been employed as an adjunct instructor for Southern New Hampshire University since 2021 and Kishwaukee Community College since 2022, and she has been in private practice since 2007 as a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor.

Recommendation:

The administration recommends the Board approve the appointment of Christy Lincoln as an Assistant Professor of Psychology beginning August 9, 2024 at an annual base salary of \$54,376.83.

I have found that students appreciate knowing this, for both my classes and others they are taking. I would also love to restart the Psychology Club. I have had many students who plan to go into the field, and I would relish the opportunity to mentor them on a more formal basis. I have lots of ideas and resources, and I am happy to share them with you.

I have done Honors projects with my students and have really enjoyed the process. If hired full-time, I would be able to increase the number of projects I can do each semester. Past projects include mental health and Sauk athletes, language acquisition, and self-reported happiness. The last project had to

change quickly, as my student and I transitioned to online learning in March of 2020. Her original hypothesis was that greater happiness is correlated with more time spent in face-to-face interactions. We had to not only change that to Zoom and Facetime interactions, but we also had to figure out a way to survey people virtually. We prevailed and she found a positive correlation between the two variables.

Thank you for considering me for this position. If hired, I will be able to pour all my energy into Sauk, and I believe that would benefit my students, the department, and the college. As a graduate of a private college and a private graduate school, I tell my students they are smarter than me every semester. Community colleges are a far more cost-effective way to get an education. I believe community colleges fill a vital role everywhere and I would love to focus on making the psychology department at Sauk even better.
