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

AUTOMOTIVE

Entry-Level Automotive Technician Program

Sauk Valley Community College and Whiteside Area Career Center are partnering to offer a seven-week Automotive Basics Program. The program will be four weeks of instruction and hands-on learning, a two-week externship (minimum of 40 hours), and three days of review and ASE test preparation. Students will gain an entry level understanding in suspension and steering, brakes, exhaust systems, and routine maintenance and servicing of vehicle systems. Minimal automotive knowledge or experience is needed to be successful in this program. The program will provide students with a solid foundation and skills to enter the automotive industry. Dedicated students will receive a tool kit and tool box before they start their externship (worth up to \$500). Students must have a valid driver's license. Space is limited to 10 students.

TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING

Midwest Safe Driver at Sauk Valley Community College

Class A CDL Training

Train to earn your Class "A" Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and prepare for a career in the trucking industry, one of the fastest growing Industries in the country. With over 300,000 truckdriving jobs available in the United States, this course is designed for students with little or no commercial driving experience.

The Sauk Valley Community College Truck Driver Training course includes everything you need to earn a Class A CDL. After successful completion of the five-week 160 training hours, you will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class A test. After successful completion you will receive an Illinois Commercial Driver's License from the Secretary of State, a certificate from Sauk Valley Community College and Midwest Safe Driver. Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday – Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation class hours run Monday – Friday; 7:30AM – 4:00PM.

Tuition for the Class A program is \$5,148 and includes the cost of a drug screen and DOT physical. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. Grant and scholarship options are available to eligible students to help cover tuition expenses. Class schedule may be adjusted due to weather or truck maintenance. Class B CDL Training

Class B CDL training allows you to transport freight that weighs less than 10,000 pounds GVWR with a single axle trailer. Experience high-quality Class B CDL training at Sauk Valley Community College. Class B CDL training is widely seen as an amazing entry point and helps prospective drivers break into the trucking industry. Vehicles that can be driven with a Class B license include dump truck, garbage truck, and snow plow. After successful completion of 160 training hours (40 classroom hours and 120 behind the wheel hours), students will be scheduled to take the Secretary of State administered Class B test. Class B Commercial License Permit classroom hours run Monday – Friday; 8:00AM-4:30PM and Commercial License Operation hours run Monday - Friday; 7:30AM -4:00PM. This program qualifies for funding by the Noncredit Workforce Training Initiative Grant from the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). The grant funds will be used to reduce the cost of the student's tuition. Students will pay the cost of permit/license (\$50) and motor vehicle record (\$20) out of pocket. (Ages 18 & Up)

FOOD SERVICE SANITATION

Food Service Sanitation: 1-day class

This course prepares students to take the food sanitation manager's license ServSafe exam in one day. Students will participate in class and take the exam on the same day. This one-day course is fast-paced and recommended but not required for students seeking renewal of their ServSafe Manager Protection License. Emphasis will be on current food handling information including time/temperature requirements for cooking, cooling and refrigeration, hand contact with ready-to-eat foods, consumer advisories, cross-contamination, cleaning and sanitizing, HACCP, and problems associated with food borne outbreaks. The exam scan sheet is included in the cost of the class. This program qualifies for funding by the Noncredit Workforce Training Initiative Grant from the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). The grant funds will be used to reduce the cost of the student's tuition. (Ages 15 & Up)

HEALTHCARE CAREER PROGRAMS

Phlebotomy Technician with Clinical Externship

This 150-hour Phlebotomy Technician Program equips students with the skills and knowledge to collect blood specimens for laboratory analysis safely and effectively. Through 50 classroom hours and 100 externship hours, students gain a solid foundation in:

- Phlebotomy terminology, anatomy, and physiology
- Blood collection procedures and techniques
- Hands-on practice with venipuncture methods
- OSHA-compliant safety practices

The program includes a clinical externship at a local healthcare facility, where students complete a minimum of 100 clinical hours and perform 100 blood draws to meet ASCP and NAACLS standards. Students may need to coordinate with their current work schedules for clinical hours, which will be arranged around classroom sessions.

8 • Professional Development

Externship requirements: Students must wear scrubs and provide current physical and immunization records (not included in program costs). Required immunizations include TB, Varicella, MMR, and Tdap, with optional COVID-19, Hepatitis B, and seasonal Flu shots.
