

# Transfer Degree Plan

## Bachelor of Science - Agriculture Teacher Education

### How 2+2 Works

- The 2+2 is a plan that leads to a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Agriculture - Teacher Education at WIU. Students will fill out applications for both schools, consult the advisors and catalogs from both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed for bachelors degree completion by taking courses at both Sauk Valley Community College and Western Illinois University (WIU). This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by Sauk Valley Community College and admission requirements for WIU.
- Upon completion of the requirements at Sauk Valley Community College, students will receive an Associate of Arts degree with a concentration in Education, Secondary. Students will be required to complete the Agriculture - Teacher Education core requirements at WIU, and upon completion of the final curriculum requirements students will receive the B.S. degree with a major in Agriculture - Teacher Education at WIU. In general, a minimum of 67 semester hours (s.h.) will be taken at Sauk Valley Community College at Sauk Valley Community College rates and 64-66 s.h. from WIU at WIU rates.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 should be achieved by the junior year. A 2.5 GPA grade point average must be earned for graduation as an Agriculture - Teacher Education major.

3. Must have 24 s.h. of Agriculture Courses completed at WIU
4. Must have at least 42 hours of courses numbered 300 or above.
5. AGRI 120 will be waived upon transfer
